What do we mean by Classwork?

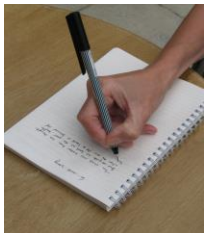
Classwork involves:

- ❖ Listening to the teacher while she speaks, take notes & follow instructions
- ❖ Getting engaged in class activities
- ❖ Using your target language in class
- ❖ Respecting others' right to learn
- ❖ Raising your hand before asking any question
- ❖ Showing a positive attitude during the lesson



Your participation in the classwork will be graded on a weekly basis.

What are Warm-Ups?



- As you enter the classroom, you will find an exercise on the smart board, related to the lesson you learned the previous day.
- Sit down and quietly follow the instructions on the board.
- When the late bell rings, you are supposed to be doing your first sentence already.
- When you finish, quietly wait until the teacher gives further instructions.
- At the end of the warm up, the teacher will go over the exercises: be ready to share your answers.
- You will get a weekly grade based on your warm up activity.

Quizzes

- Quizzes will be given often, usually during a teaching unit/chapter
- They will NOT be based only on textbook, but also on teacher's explanation of rules and expressions (so make sure to take notes!)



Tests

- Tests will be given periodically, usually at the end of a teaching unit/chapter
- They will NOT be based only on textbook, but also on teacher's explanation of rules and expressions (so make sure to take notes!)



4. Homework

- At the end of each lesson, you will receive a short assignment for homework. The teacher will say it orally, but it will also be posted on Remind and Googleclassroom.com
- Take a few minutes every night and do your assignment.
 - Create a folder for this class on your computer and save your assignment in your digital portfolio, and/or print out a copy for the teacher.
 - On the following day, put your assignment on your desk before doing your warm-up: the teacher will walk around and collect it.



Digital Portfolio/Website page.

Each student will need to have a **DIGITAL PORTFOLIO**, a folder where they save documents, power-point presentations, pictures, videos –assignments collected over the months, word documents with dialogues, scanned versions of completed assignments, etc.

In addition to the Digital Portfolio, students will maintain an original blog. Students will share the folder and blog with the instructor. Details will be provided once we start using them.
